### CLARION BOROUGH RECYCLING PROGRAM

MATERIAL	WHAT CAN BE RECYCLED AT THIS TIME	WHAT CANNOT BE RECYCLED AT THIS TIME	HOW TO PREPARE MATERIALS FOR RECYCLING
Glass	Clear, amber and green glass from beverage bottles and food jars	Window glass, light bulbs, crystal, glass tumblers, ceramics	Rinse bottles and jars remove lids
Aluminum Steel and Bi-Metal Cans	Aluminum, steel, bi-metal food cans and aerosol cans	Aluminum siding, toys or lawn furniture, paint cans	Rinse cans (crush if space is needed)
Plastics (PETE HDPE) Stamped #1 or #2	Clear, plastic soda bottles, milk and water jugs, liquid detergent, bleach and softener bottles	Cooking oil, motor oil, window cleaner, butter or whipped topping tubs, antifreeze, pump top or spray bottles, polystyrene (cups or plates) or toys	Rinse, remove metal lids, crush plastics
Newsprint	Anything printed on newsprint paper will be recycled	Magazines and colored sections	Place newspaper in a paper bag or tie them and place on top of other recyclables**

**\*\*If weather is inclement, do not put newspaper out for collection. We suggest you wait for a better day. If you must put out newspaper in bad weather place on top of recyclables in bin and drape weighted plastic over newsprint to keep dry.**

**RECYCLING REMINDERS**

- 1) Set out for pickup the night before your scheduled day.
- 2) Rinse recyclables clean and discard lids
- 3) Place no more than 5 feet from the roadside for pickup
- 4) If you have extra recycling place in another container with the word "recycle" marked on it visible to the driver.
- 5) Wet newsprint or recyclables in plastic bags will not be accepted.
- 6) Recyclables that are co-mingled (contaminated) with non-recyclable items will not be picked up

**OPTIONAL SERVICES**

**WHITE GOODS** - \$25.00 per item (freon items included). Payment and scheduling in advance are required

**TIRES** - from small trucks (pickups) and cars will be accepted for \$20.00 per tire. Payment and scheduling in advance are required.

**PAINT CANS** - can be included with recyclables for no charge as long as cans are empty and lids are removed
